

Killarney Racecourse Visual Guide




Europe's most westerly racecourse- and undoubtedly, it's most scenic.

October.**




**Racing is mainly held in the

How to get there?

The course is halfway down Ross Road. Race days can be busy on the road.

The racecourse is a 10 minute walk from Killarney House and gardens and the town.


You can rent a bicycle OR take a jaunting cart.



How to get there?

Driving to the Racecourse is another option.

Parking is available inside the track and in car parks adjacent to the racecourse and is well signposted on entrance routes to the racecourse.
